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Earth Detox: how and why we must clean up our planet

Our chemical emissions are five times larger than our total greenhouse emissions!

Chemicals are in our food, our water, the air we breathe and everything we touch. Last year an international team found about 350,000 chemicals registered for production and use, but it's hard to know for sure, because tens of thousands are shrouded in secrecy. It's a multi-trillion dollar industry - and getting bigger. Julian Cribb is a science writer who's telling us that we've unleashed a chemical tsunami on the world, with catastrophic implications for humanity. His book, *Earth Detox*, makes for grim reading. But it also offers a ten-point plan on how we can turn the polluted tide around.

He describes how we find ourselves our environments, bodies and clothes contaminated by chemicals, but also shines a light some paths to a cleaner, greener, healthier world.

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Justified consternation?

I see that Kapiti Council has updated their bylaws for 2021 and slipped in an anti-nudity clause. See [Untitled \(kapiticoast.govt.nz\)](#) clause 5.2 :-

5. Appropriate Behaviour

5.1 No person shall use any dressing shed or toilet except for its intended purpose, nor loiter in or around any dressing shed or toilet.

5.2 No person shall remain on any part of the beach in deliberate view of others in such a state of undress as to cause offence.

Who defines a 'state of undress'? Even togs are a state of undress. So anyone who wants to complain and claim that they are 'offended'?

They don't give up. I wonder who can be complained to about illegal/unlawful byelaws...

I understand Mike's consternation, however there are a couple of aspects to consider...

First, upon examination of the previous (2009) Kapiti District Council Bylaw I see that version has the same wording for the same clause (so it hasn't been *recently* slipped in).

Second, to legally 'cause offence' to the 'reasonable person' although the 'state of undress' may be regarded as: 'inappropriate, unnecessary, and in bad taste, but [does] not arousing feelings of anger, disgust, or outrage.' Justice Tomkins concludes: "That reaction ... falls somewhat short of the reaction required to be established beyond reasonable doubt, in order to amount to offensive behaviour sufficient to justify the interference of the criminal law."

In short, I don't think that there is any real problem with the wording of that bylaw and 10 years of no relevant court case in the Kapiti area tends to confirm our safety there. (JL)

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Where did Google hide Family Naturism?

The online naturist world is a weird one. That much is sure. For many, it has been a blessing. People living in countries where social nudity is forbidden by law, now have the chance to interconnect with each other. Naturists that have a partner who's not into social nudity can find their peers online. Probably all of us have found a great new naturist vacation destination somewhere online. And also for ourselves, naturist bloggers, this very blog wouldn't exist if it wasn't for the worldwide web.

Earlier today, we were writing a blog post for our Dutch naturist blog on the Athena website. We were discussing the topic of online naturism and doing a bit of research on the dark side of the internet. You know, when you google "naturism" or "nudism" and suddenly end up on a variety of porn sites. For our test, we goggled "family nudism." It's a test that we've probably done a million times before when we wanted to make a point. It used to bring us to numerous malicious websites where you could buy packages of family naturist pictures. We believe that people should pay us to look at pictures of their children, but apparently, many others think differently.

Just like that, family nudism was gone

Although Google did tell us that they found about 152 million results for "family nudism," they only showed us about 30. That's 3 pages. How on earth did that happen? To give you a point of comparison, we also Goggled "cheesecake", which showed 250 pages (about Google's maximum), and even when the cat ran over our keyboard and typed "qsdghjklm", Google still managed to show 115 results. This is something that intrigues us quite a lot. Apparently, if you're interested in "qsdghjklm", you'll find four times as much information on Google than if you're interested in family nudism.

For us, the most shocking part was that Naked Wanderings was nowhere to be seen in the search results. We've written several blog posts about family naturism, we even gave tips for first-time family nudists. But they were not there. Instead, there were websites of several newspapers, mostly telling stories about how controversial nudity within the family can be - telling a story about how a nude family swimming event in the UK had to become adults only - or about an illegal COVID-party on a nude beach in Australia.

Why we can't blame Google

Google has been our best friend for a long time. Without Google, we may have never been able to pass high school. Also today, Google brings people to our website. Naturists, who are looking for vacation destinations. But, since recently, no more naturists who want to learn about naturism within the family. It's a hard nut to crack because we are absolutely sure that we have brought joy into families that are interested in naturism.

Ever since the very beginning of our naturist blogging life, we have been the first to complain about all the dirt that was available online. About how naturist pictures get stolen and used in the wrong way. Every single time that we goggled "family naturism" and were directed to a variety of pay-sites before our own Naked Wanderings showed up, felt like a stab in the back. Today, we feel like collateral damage. If in order to remove all the online crap, Naked Wanderings has to



be removed as well, we're happy to take that hit. Because we are sure that people will keep finding us through other channels. And we can only hope that this isn't the same for those other websites.

The difficulty of online naturism

Some of you may wonder, "how can you just be ok with this?" Here's the difficulty: companies like Google rely on algorithms. Processes that can make decisions without human interference. In naturism, algorithms have always been against us. Naturism is such a human thing that you just can't put it into computer processes. Think about it, what's the difference between a genuine naturist image and an erotic image. We've all seen the pictures of the nude young girl on the beach, legs at a certain angle, eyes straight at the camera. They're being shared as naturist pictures, but we all know better. Then there's the other picture, similar pose but the woman is having a nap, reading a book, or chatting with another person. Suddenly, it's genuine naturism.

There's no algorithm that can determine the difference. Eroticism is in the eyes, not in the body. It's in the intention behind the picture. Something a human can see in the blink of an eye, but something a computer can never recognise. It's the same with websites. For us naturists, it only takes seconds to figure out whether a certain website genuinely promotes naturism or is just some fake portal to promote dating or to sell pictures of naked people. But how's a computer to know?

It's the struggle we currently also see on social media. Facebook and Instagram just don't have a clue of how to build an algorithm that differentiates sexual nudity from non-sexual nudity. So they just ban nudity altogether. Apparently, Google is somewhat moving in the same direction. If we can't separate the chaff from the wheat, we'll just throw the wheat completely down the drain.

Is this a success or a disaster for naturism? Only time can tell.

By about 22 I'd got past the search for a fixed spiritual base. I'd realised by then that I could survive happily on that front with a floating foundation; firmly based on physics.

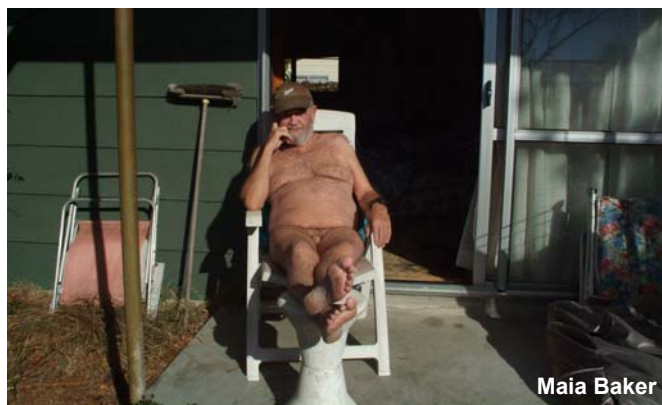
However, it's only recently in the subsequent 70-odd years that I've realised why I've felt pretty well served so far by this basic stability.

The Marketing Workshop

As a non-participant of the recent Marketing Workshop, the subsequent reports of it indicate participation of around 20 people from at least six clubs around the country. (Some unidentified technical failure blocked my attempt to join in.)

The Federation had put together four points as discussion prompts, and some responses of interest were evoked. But from my point of view most of them have been tried.

It seems to me that what is actually required is dedication to the cause by diligent activists, in it for the long haul!

So what endeavours might be amenable to gathering general interest from the widest audience?

Well, normally, in these pages I try to stick to New Zealand focussed events - for presumably obvious reasons. So when I came across a guy in New York running body painting workshops in Times Square a while ago, I noted it and 'moved on'. But now it has occurred to me: that may have been a premature dismissal!



In New Zealand we have several representations of the World Naked Bike Ride around the country, and they all have a set-up procedure which involves at least a bit of body-painting. They've occurred in Takaka, Auckland, Mt Maunganui, Hawkes Bay, Middlemarch, Waimate and near Hamilton, so far.

We have a general acceptance of these events by both the public and police - so let us try extending them, little by little, but *persistently*!

I had originally assumed that it was the nudity that would create the interest in these events, but now I'm convinced that it's actually the art, rather than the nudity - especially for women. I have been convinced by the founder of the website: humanconnectionarts.org -

Our mission is to share who we are as human beings, to build a community accepting of ourselves and each other.

Through interactive public art events we follow our vision to inspire human connection around the world.

Since 2007, Andy Golub has painted bodies in the public streets of New York City on hundreds of occasions. At first glance, these performances may seem innocuous, but they actually address a variety of societal issues:-

- Contrast between art and advertising in the public space;
- Role of street art versus gallery art;
- Appropriateness of public nudity;
- Distinction between nudity and sexuality; and
- Use of the human form as an aesthetic versus personal identity.

So really I should have encouraged my photographer, Maia (left) to have go at applying her various face-paints to the lump on the chair, rather than her face... perhaps. (JL)

What is Naturism to you?

While chatting with other naturists, browsing naturist websites and reading the writings of naturist writers, I realised that naturism means different things to each of us. Even, and above all, when we talk to textiles, naturism is defined, perceived and understood differently. I'll try to go through these views.

Even though it's not about putting on labels or putting people in boxes, it is interesting to consider different points of view to better understand the differences and live better together in harmony. Naturism is not the answer to the evil of disrespect or the answer to more tolerance in the world. It carries with it values that are necessary for a more peaceful, gentler and more respectful world. Understanding the point of view of others allows us to better meet everyone's expectations and to contribute to this listening if necessary.

The disgusted textile

"Me naked? Never. It's only for animals and crazy people." How many times have I heard a sentence like this? Not only does it degrade the concept, it reduces the concept of naturism and it does not seek to consider a different point of view, above all it closes the door to any open or benevolent discussion.

Nudity then, is seen as dirty and shameful, and its practitioners ostracized; labelled as uneducated people. The textile then looks away, shocked by this nudity exposed for all to see. This person will close the bathroom door and come out only dressed. There is usually no point in trying to convince her with rational arguments. Her mental construction of nudity is firmly anchored by religious, social, cultural or moral principles.

It will then be almost impossible to undress in the presence of such a person. The only hope is then to make him accept nudity and to make him admit its harmlessness. In short, to transform it from disgusted textiles into disinterested textiles.

The disinterested textile

The disinterested textile is one that social nudity does not interest, but she does not interfere with. He sees no reason to undress alone or with others and is comfortable with his or her clothes, even a simple swimsuit.

However, this textile will not be too bothered by the sight of naturists and will be able to coexist with "naked butts." She shows a form of respect. She stays dressed while those around her enjoy the freedom to be naked.

These are the people naturists are looking for first. They allow them to live naked while respecting their desire to be clothed. Respect is then mutual and harmony can be found. Disinterested textiles can also, in contact with these happy naturists, be tempted by the experience of nudity. He then goes into the camp of curious textiles.

The curious textile

A textile becomes curious and questions this need to be naked and the benefits of simple and shared nudity. The naturist will then be best inspired not only to answer his questions, but above all to offer him a try.

The first experience is often decisive. Being accompanied by one or more seasoned naturists is a big plus for your comfort. Surrounded by experienced nudists, the curious can have immediate answers to her questions and feel confident.

A point that seems crucial to me with the curious is to help him transform his attempt at naturism. For example, by offering him another outing: a barbecue or a stay in a naturist resort. Naturism needs more regular practitioners. Help him to pass on the bright side of the force and to become a convinced naturist and at least for the moment, bohemian.

The bohemian naturist

Naturism is practiced in a naturist area with other naturists. If this statement is true, it is well suited to new naturists who wish to practice this art of living on weekends and on vacation. It is then bohemian naturism, which is experienced in a regulated and authorized space.

This is very good and it seems to suit a majority of naturists. This helps bring naturism and naturist spaces to life, including beaches and free spaces like the one in the Bois de Vincennes in the East of Paris.

If the bohemian naturist likes to be naked in the middle of other naturists, she does not necessarily consider practicing



her naturism elsewhere. It is then the meeting of a comfortable or hard-working naturist who can present him with the alternatives available for the practice of naturism and he can become completely comfortable.

The comfortable naturist

The comfortable naturist becomes comfortable when it becomes a real art of living that begins at home. Transforming your home into a naturist haven is a major step in creating comfort.

Making your home a naturist place makes nudity a daily art of living. Almost nothing at home requires the wearing of clothing apart from some hazardous work such as frying food. It is therefore possible, even in winter, to live naked: only dress for going out.

New perspectives open up, for example that of transposing this everyday nudity to another place. A trip to the countryside? Naturist! A weekend with friends? Naturist! A short stay away from home? Naturist! And now our comfortable naturist is on the way to relentlessness.

The relentless naturist

This last type of naturist, I describe as relentless, because for him or her, any occasion is good to get naked. The house is her naturist haven of peace, but any place can become it.

A forest is a naturist place. All the beaches are naturist places. Hiking trails include naturists. As soon as the weather permits, the relentless naturist seeks to be naked. The sight of a swimsuit gives her pimples. Clothing is a hindrance to their well-being.

If she respects textiles, she wants that respect to be mutual. she doesn't hesitate to ask if she can get naked whenever she can. Nudity is her first choice of clothing. You could call her obsessed by naturism, I can accept that, because that's what I think I am, but in a good way. Not something that consumes you, but makes you happy. Because naturism does make you happy!

Strip naked, stay naked, live naked and share the naked love!

A GROUP DILEMMA LAID BARE

Among the perennial questions our community grapples with: how "exposed" do we want to be?

We operate a conference centre, hold courses and workshops, host visitors, and receive frequent postal and freight deliveries. More often than not, our conference guests, students, and visitors fall on the socially progressive side of the spectrum, but most are not unreconstructed hippies or obviously enlightened indigo, crystal, or rainbow children. Nor are the relatives of everyone who lives here. Nor, indeed, are all of us.

Our neighbours aren't either, and have a tendency to leap to quick conclusions on seemingly scant evidence. A drumming and chanting ceremony at the fire circle years ago precipitated a persistent rumour that we were a satanic cult. The logical leap from "glimpse of skin" to "nudist colony" is a surprisingly short one to make, within some neighbours' mentality.

We've defined "clothing required" and "clothing optional" zones in our community, but few community members are fully satisfied with these. Clothing is required in areas that are visible from our main drive, and that are in or around our main dining area, kitchens, offices, and classrooms. It is generally required in any areas used by conference guests, when they are here, even in those that are normally clothing optional. It is optional in most places that are generally used only by the community, as long as they are not in sight of our main drive, a neighbour's property, or a road.

We generally agree on the meaning and application of "clothing optional": complete nudity is acceptable. "Clothing required" is more tricky to define.

In most places other than our certified kitchen, male toplessness is accepted and practiced in hot weather. However, female toplessness is not accorded the same status.

Every few years, this becomes a topic of discussion at a community meeting. We all agree that the distinction is patently unfair to women, who are required to endure discomfort that men are not. But the "public" part of our identity - and our economic reliance on it - always lead to the same conclusion: we can't change the policy by which required clothing includes tops for women, but not for men.

Some men and women have lobbied for a ban on male toplessness wherever female toplessness is not allowed. Others have suggested that men can show support for women by voluntarily resisting the urge to take off their shirts in these circumstances. Others have said that male toplessness is the first step toward liberation, and that one step is better than none. Others have suggested that we change the policy to allow both male and female toplessness, and let the chips fall where they may in terms of impact on our reputation and businesses. And still others have suggested that in the absence of an immediate policy change, civil disobedience is the appropriate response: breaking our own rules to force the issue, and as a step toward getting comfortable enough to overturn them officially.

Ironically, toplessness is totally legal in our area for women as well as men - including on the streets of the nearest city. But a combination of conservative rural neighbours and a diverse clientele has kept our community - which sees itself as "ahead of the times" in most realms; behind the times here.

Although this gets under many community members' skin - at the same time that it keeps many community members' skin under clothing - the compromise endures.

On hot days, M. Broiling and T. Shirtless are (respectively) sweltering, and comfortable, around the community picnic tables at lunchtime.

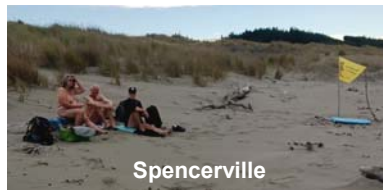

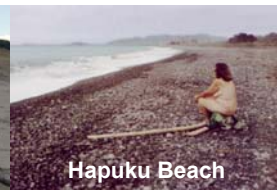

In Northland, on the road to East Beach only 4 km from S H 1 is Raewyn & Rosco's Ostrich farm which offers direct access to the Rangaunu Harbour. Relax on a deck or go kayaking in the ocean estuary. Alongside the banana trees you'll find plenty of room for vans, tents and other accommodation.



Aside from the fascinating, unique interior decorations downstairs, there are two splendid bedrooms available upstairs.



Raewyn & Rosco's farm has plenty of room for parking, whatever vehicle you arrive in. On-site accommodation includes a caravan with double bed (and nearby external toilet) while upstairs in their house you'll find a twin room and a double room with ensuite. Outside, along with the big bird life, two kayaks are available for exploration of the Rangaunu Harbour, which is easily accessed through the mangroves on their southern border. Easy access to East Beach is 9km further along Kaimaumau Road: drive to the end and walk 200 m north.

They're only 13 km north of Awanui (which is 6km north of Kaitaia); turn right 3km north of Waiharara, into Kaimaumau Rd. The farm is 4km east, with its entrance on the right.
